Hand sanitiser facilities will be provided at the entrance to all toilets and must be used by anyone entering and leaving the premises. Masks should also be worn by anyone entering the toilets. Signage will be in place to remind everyone to maintain social distancing, one- way systems introduced where required, and signs reminding everyone to wash their hands regularly.
